#### INDIGENT COUNSEL

As a result of the United States Supreme Court Decision in the  $\frac{\text{Argersinger}}{\text{all indigent}}$  case, legal representation must be provided without charge to all indigent persons accused of certain crimes.

The Parma City Council, in 1974, passed Ordinance No. 192-74 providing for payment of indigent legal representation. Attorney James W. Burke, Jr. was contracted to act as Indigent Counsel.

Attorney James W. Burke, Jr. represented indigent persons in the following misdemeanors and felonies for the year of 1992.
