

INDIGENT COUNSEL

As a result of the United States Supreme Court Decision in the Argersinger case, legal representation must be provided, without charge, to all indigent persons accused of certain crimes.

The Parma City Council, in 1974, passed Ordinance No. 192-74 providing for payment of indigent legal representation. Attorney James W. Burke, Jr., was contracted to act as Indigent Counsel.
