INDIGENT COUNSEL

As a result of the United States Supreme Court Decision in the <u>Argersinger</u> case, legal representation must be provided, without charge, to all indigent persons accused of certain crimes.

The Parma City Council, in 1974, passed Ordinance No. 192-74 providing for payment of indigent legal representation. Attorney James W. Burke, Jr., was contracted to act as Indigent Counsel.
